This certificate can lead to an apprenticeship/traineeship or other supervised roles within the horticultural industry, including general hand, nursery assistant, environmental field operator, grounds-person and bushland regenerator.

Location

Due dates for activities, assessments and assignments will be advised by the lecturers.


