Course	Description	Career Opportunities
Certificate II in Animal Care ACM20121 (Complete 3 terms, starting 2 December 2025) Year 10 students may apply Applied Vocational Training RTO Code: 5273 <i>A Readiness Assessment will be required before entry into this course and will determine the participants.</i>	Students will gain hands-on skills working with a range of companion and farm animals at Landsdale Farm. You will learn workplace safety in the animal care industry and the fundamentals of handling and approaching animals, caring for animals, feeding practices, first aid and animal behaviour.	Successful completion of this course meets the prerequisite for the Certificate IV in Veterinary Nursing.
Certificate II in Automotive Vocational Preparation AUR20720 (Complete 3 terms) Automotive Institute of Technology Inc (MTA WA) Balcatta RTO Code: 0627	This qualification will introduce you to the practical skills and knowledge used in the automotive trades. You will learn a broad range of skills to help you decide your automotive pathway.	Successful completion of this qualification provides you with the opportunity to enter a pre-apprenticeship or an apprenticeship to become an Automotive Light or Heavy Vehicle Mechanic or an Automotive Electrician. Work placement during school holidays and exam breaks is expected.
Certificate III & IV in Business BSB30120 BSB40120 (Cert III Complete 3 terms) (Cert IV Complete 4 terms start 21 October 2025, Year 12 only) AWA Training, Joondalup RTO Code: 52946	These qualifications reflect the varied roles of individuals across different industry sectors. Students will learn to apply a broad range of competencies using some discretion, judgment and relevant theoretical knowledge.	Business Administration: record keeping, marketing, advertising, purchasing, small business management, administrator, project officer, accounts clerk, customer service advisor etc. Work experience during school holidays and exam breaks will be required.
Certificate III & IV in Community Services CHC32015 CHC42021 (Cert III Complete 3 terms) (Cert IV Complete 3 terms, Year 12 only) Fremantle Education Centre RTO Code: 50354	This qualification applies to community work delivered through a broad range of services, which provide support to individuals and groups. This level is appropriate for support workers and client contact officers.	Workers at this level may have direct contact with clients, identifying and presenting needs and referral to appropriate services and support. Work experience will be required during school holidays and exam breaks.
Certificate II in Building and Construction (Pathway - Carpentry) 52893WA (Complete 2 years) Year 10 students may apply North Metropolitan TAFE Balga RTO Code: 52786	You will learn to use hand and power tools; construct wall frames; install flooring; interpret plans; measure and calculate the right amount of materials for the job; levelling operations; work with scaffolding safely at heights; and workplace health and safety.	In addition to attending classes you will be required to undertake 110 hours of work experience over two years during school holidays and exam breaks. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Apprentice Carpenter • Carpenter • Building Supervisor
Certificate III in Early Childhood Education and Care CHC30121 (Complete 3 terms) Fremantle Education Centre RTO Code: 50354	This qualification reflects the role of workers in a range of early childhood education settings. They support the implementation of an approved learning framework and support children's wellbeing, learning and development.	On completion of this qualification in Year 11, students can articulate into Cert IV School Based Education & Support, Business or Community Services. Students will need to complete 160 hrs of work experience during school holidays and exam breaks, in a registered childcare centre.
Certificate II Electrotechnology UEE22020 (Complete 2 Years) College of Electrical Training Joondalup RTO Code: 2349 <i>A Readiness Assessment will be required before entry into this course and will determine the participants.</i>	This training program will provide you with the foundation practical skills and theory knowledge required in electrical installation and servicing. You will learn a broad range of skills to help you decide if you wish to follow the electrical pathway. You will learn skills in basic electrical wiring and terminations, electrical theory, hand and power tools and using electrical diagrams.	Successful completion of this course over the 2 years will be credited towards a pathway in an apprenticeship program or to other trade areas such as data communications, security, electronic servicing, etc. Some work placement must be completed during exam breaks and some school holidays. A total of 150 hours of work placement must be completed over the 2 years.
Certificate III in Fitness SIS30321 (Complete 3 terms) RTO - Sero Institute @ Diamond Fitness Osborne Park RTO Code: 32303	Delivered in the Diamond Fitness high-performance gym, this AIF course will give you world class Fitness Industry skills. You will implement the latest health, fitness, and training principles into your programs, as well as learn nutritional information to strengthen your ability when conducting fitness tests and appraisals with your clients.	Upon successful completion in Year 11, you will receive your AIF Certificate III in Fitness which will progress you towards the AIF Certificate IV in Fitness course, in Year 12 or post school. The Certificate III prepares you for the following potential career opportunities Fitness Coach, Gym Instructor, Group Exercise Instructor and Fitness Manager.
Certificate IV in Fitness SIS40221 (Complete 3 terms) Prerequisite Cert III Fitness RTO - Sero Institute @ Diamond Fitness Osborne Park RTO Code: 32303	This qualification reflects the role of personal trainers who develop, instruct and evaluate personalised exercise programs for generally healthy and low risk clients, to achieve specific fitness goals. They use well-developed communication and collaboration skills to interact with clients and health professionals to improve client fitness outcomes.	This qualification provides a pathway to work as an employed or self-employed personal trainer in settings such as fitness facilities, gyms, leisure and community centres, client workplaces and homes, and outdoor locations. In some employment contexts, personal trainers may be involved in team leadership or supervisory activities.

Certificate III in Health Services Assistance HLT33115 (Complete 3 terms) Health Science HUB Perth RTO Code: 52806 <i>This course will start on 4 February 2025</i>	This course is suitable for people who are naturally caring, wishing to pursue a career in the practical health care environment with direct patient contact or a pathway to further studies within health. It prepares students for health care and nursing with skills in medical terminology, anatomy and physiology, infection control, health care communication, medical observations, basic emergency response, movement of patients and WHS.	The unique hospital setting can include careers as an Admissions Clerk, Ward Clerk, Ward Assistant, Patient Care Assistant, Patient Services Attendance, Orderly, Nursing support worker. Community work in (eg Disability / Aging) or pathway with direct entry into Diploma of Science, ECC (Edith Cowan College) and then pathway to UNI - ECU 2nd year Nursing or variety of Health Science Degree programs. 80 hours work experience during school holidays and exam breaks will be required in an aged care facility.
Certificate IV in Preparation for Health & Nursing Studies 52895WA (Complete 3 terms, Year 12 only) Health Science HUB, Murdoch University RTO Code: 52806 <i>This course will start on 4 February 2025</i>	This training program will provide you with foundational knowledge in how the human body works and how disease can prevent normal functioning, as well as the basics of medication management. You will also learn how to research, reference, and report at University level so that you will have an advantage moving into studying a bachelor degree.	Successful completion of this course will provide you with a pathway into university as completion of a Certificate IV satisfies the entry requirement (the equivalent of a 70 ATAR score). Work experience during school holidays and exam breaks will be required.
Certificate II in Plumbing (Plumbing Pre-Apprenticeship) 52887WA (Complete 2 years) Year 10 students may apply North Metropolitan TAFE Balga RTO Code: 52786	This course will provide you with the practical skills and knowledge required for a career in the plumbing and servicing industry. You will learn skills in basic plumbing, how to weld using oxy-acetylene and how to cut and join sheet metal.	In addition to attending classes you will be required to undertake 150 hours of work placement over two years with a registered Plumber (Licenced Contractor) during school holidays and exam breaks. This will give you the opportunity to be involved in the trade and see exactly what a plumber does on a daily basis. Hep A & B immunisations are recommended.
Certificate II in Resources and Infrastructure Work Preparation RI120120 (Complete 1 Semester) Year 10 students may apply Bright Education Rivervale RTO Code: 45006 <i>\$40 uniform and visit costs</i>	This course helps students build the core skills and confidence needed to take the first steps into the resources and construction sectors. It is delivered through a mix of hands-on and face-to-face learning at our modern, purpose-built training facility in Rivervale. The course focuses on developing practical knowledge and the ability to carry out everyday tasks safely and effectively.	This is a work ready program. Successful completion of the course provides a career pathway into the resources and construction sector. Included in the course are Working in Confined Spaces, Working at Heights and a White Card, which means you can start work immediately. Completion of this course can lead to: Trades Assistant, Resource / Mining Worker, Civil and Construction Labourer, Apprenticeship
Certificate II in Salon Assistant SHB20216 (Complete 4 Terms) Year 10 students may apply Taylorweir Northbridge RTO Code: 1896 <i>\$395 kit cost</i>	The SHB20216 Certificate II in Salon Assistant is a preparatory qualification which provides you with a range of basic skills and knowledge that you will use in client services within hairdressing salons and barbershops. On completion, six units of competence will be credit transferred to either Certificate III in Hairdressing or Certificate III in Barbering.	The skills you will learn in the Certificate II in Salon Assistant qualification can be transferred to a variety of professions. By participating in this qualification, you will you be able to determine if hairdressing or barbering is your calling. If it is, you have a world of opportunity open to you to join one the most exciting and rewarding careers. If after completing your course you decide hairdressing or barbering is not what you would like to do, all is not wasted as you have gained the soft skills needed to be extremely employable.
Certificate III & IV in School Based Education Support CHC30221 CHC40221 (Cert III Complete 3 terms) Cert IV Complete 4 terms start 21 October 2025, Year 12 only Fremantle Education Centre RTO Code: 50354	This qualification reflects the role of workers in a range of education settings who provide assistance and support to teachers and students under broad supervision.	Examples of Employment opportunities: Early Childhood Educator, Family Day Care Educator, Education Assistant. 100 hours of workplace learning will be conducted during exam breaks and Term 3, in a classroom environment.
Certificate II Tourism SIT20122 (Complete 3 terms) Year 10 students may apply North Metropolitan TAFE Northbridge RTO Code: 52786 <i>\$40 uniform and visit costs</i>	Begin your journey with the Certificate II in Tourism, where you'll gain essential industry skills in visitor information, accommodation reception services, and customer service, while building confidence through public speaking and tour guiding foundations.	Then, in 2027 step up to the Certificate III in Events, where you'll get hands-on experience working at live events, as well as planning and running your own! Learn how to create eye-catching displays, coordinate ticketing and registration, and produce a suite of professional business event documents to support your event planning and delivery. Together, these qualifications open the door to exciting opportunities in tourism, hospitality, and event industries across Australia and beyond.
